INSURANCE The club holds the following policys.

- (1) <u>Public Liability Indemnity Policy</u>. This covers Bristol Waterworks and U.B.S.S. for any claim made by us (Members of M.C.G.) in respect of accidental bodily injury (fatal or non-fatal) or accidental damage to property. The limit for any one occurrence is £25,000. Number of claims is unlimited. This only covers G.B. and Longwood/August and it must be the fault of the Waterworks or U.B.S.S.
- (2) <u>Fire Policy</u>. Furniture, Fixtures, Fittings and Caving Equipment which is Group Property and at the cottage is insured for £200 against damage by fire. Personal effects of Group Members in so far as that they are not otherwise insured for an amount not exceeding £10 in respect of any one member. Sum insured £200.
- (3) <u>Burglary Policy</u>. Furniture, Fittings, Fixtures and Caving Equipment which is Group property at the cottage is insured for £200 against theft, Personal effects of Group members insofar that they are not otherwise insured for an amount not exceeding £10 in respect of any one member, Sum insured £200.
