LONDON CAVE RESCUE ORGANISATION There will be a practice week-end on 10/11th November in South. Wales. All those interested please contact the Meet Secretary.

WITHYBROOK SLOCKER. Mention was made last month of a possible new extension of this cave made by the Wessex Cave Club, in addition to the new passage discovered by Allan Cowley and Dave Mitchell last yaer. On putting the facts before these two members they reply "It is absolutely beyond anydoubt whatsoever that they have rediscovered the passage in which we dumped our excavation material from our recent <u>newly</u> discovered passage down the stream.

The passage which we blocked and they dug out was originally opened by Messrs Browne in 1947, they found approx' 50ft of passage ending in a very small rift from which a stream could be heard.

As a matter of interest a pack of explosive was accidently dropped down it and was never recovered".

<u>AUGUST HOLE DISCOVERY</u> An overnight digging trip was organised by Tony Knibbs, Meet Secretary on September 29/30th. They dug mainly in the Oxbows at the downstream end. After some eight feet of digging they broke into a small passage, adding in all about 20ft to the length of the cave.

Extract from an articl; in"The Times" in 1382, written by a correspondat of that paper on a trip down Lamb Leer soon after it was reopened.

"In single file, each carrying a candle stuck in a holder of still clay, we crawled on for some minutes, went down another ladder, and after more progression on hands and knees, found the passage rising and spreading into an elegant Gothic Arcade"- "We stood up one after another".

"Some benzoline was poured out and ignited, and instantly the dull, grey wall was transformed into a radiant dome, built up tier above tier, of crystal pillars, by turns of purest shell pink and amber gold, over which fell in heavy folds a curtain of rich velvet brown, fringed with long pointed pendants of frosted silver, a trembling diamond on every point."

"A steep and tortuous gully, which was in many parts so narrow that we were compelled to proceed in the fashion of lizards through the mud."

"Looking up, I saw Mr McMurtrie, whose life is precious to Geology, hanging like a clough 80ft above my heap, candle in hand, and slowly revolving." "Having washed our hands in a pool of clear water,

we sat down to a luncheon, which included everything usually provided at picnics, with the addition of alt and the limestone butter of the slopes above. We hay about the feast in various postures on the rocks, everyone covered with the bright red ocre mud. The two miners stood by, with boards stuck full of candles, and waited on us. Presently two members of the party retired out of sight and sang solos."

" A verse of the National Anthem was sung by the entire company".
