Your hydrologically, hobservant, honorary secretary noted an interesting phenomena during a recent very week-end. A week-end when the humidity could be measured in feet, and most major caves on Mendip were flooded.

Whilst working in the dig over a period of some 3 hours, it was noticed that the water level dropped abruptly. Heavy rain fell during the night and morning, but ceased by midday when the cave was entered. Water poured from every crack and fissure and water flowed well over the DAM. At the end of the digging session, the stream had dropped to half its initial level, but the lake in the valley rose some 18" during the same period.

Assuming that no blockage of the water channel took place during this period, this indicates that little, if any, of the Upper Flood Stream is derived from the lakes and stream in Upper Velvet Bottom Valley. An interesting thought to leave you with

A NEW INSTRUMENT FOR MEASURING DISTANCES IN CAVES

The December Edition of "Die Höhle" gives an account of a new cave surveying instrument developed by Eumig for the Austrian Academy for Science.

A semi-conductor laser is ued to generate pulses in the far infra-red wavelength. The pulsed beam is aimed at the target, whose distance is to be measured, and some part of the beam is reflected back into the receiver optics. The target distance is derived from the time lapse of the returning pulses and displayed on a digital read out.

The prototype instrument was capable of being used up to a distance of 20 metres, but it is hoped to extend this up to 50 metres. Measurements can be made with an experimental error of \pm 10 cms. The instrument weighs 1.4 Kg and measures 106 x 110x 72 mms.

A portable laser range-finder has an obvious application in cave surveying. The biggest advantage is probably the speed with which it can be used. It also overcomes one of the cave surveyors' biggest headaches - measuring the heights of chambers, avens, and rift passages.

If you fancy a speleo - electronic project, I'll give you one guess what one-up gadget the group could use.
