ANNUAL SUBSCRIPTION INCREASED FOR 1989

From 1st January 1989 the annual subscription to the Mendip Caving Group is £20 for full and probationary members, and £10 for associate members. In addition to the current benefits, this will entitle members to free access to the cottage at any time by the member, his/her accompanied guests, and his/her own children aged under 18. No additional day fees will be expected from members for day use of cottage facilities.

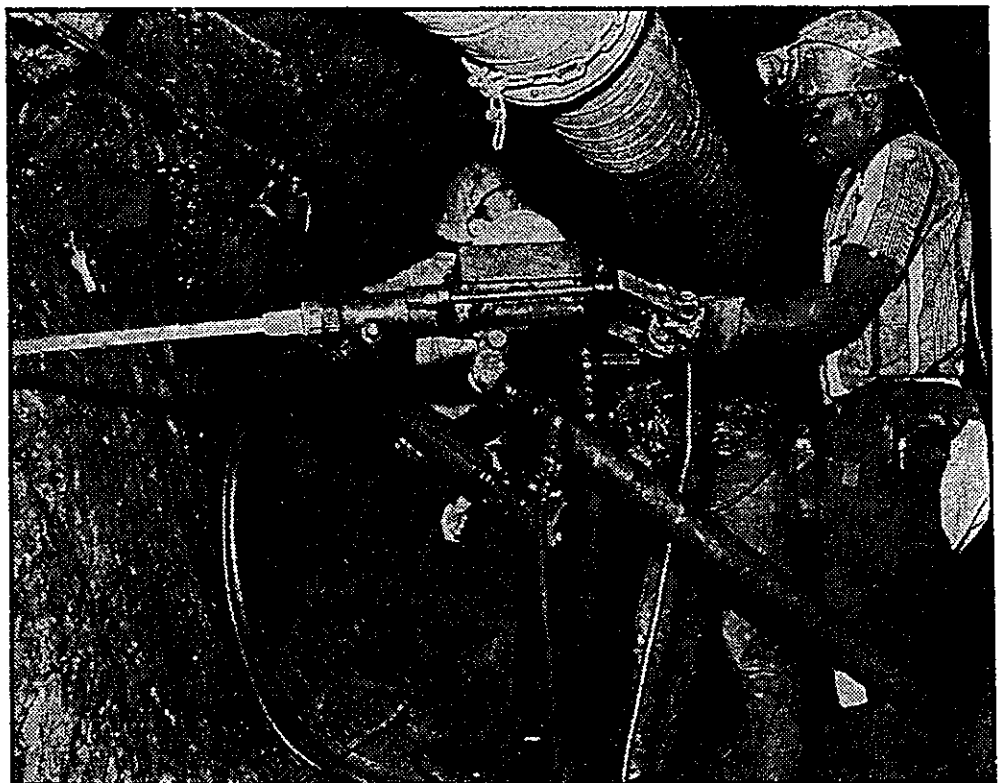
This was agreed at the EGM on 3rd December 1988. The EGM was called by the committee following the suggestion that membership subscriptions / cottage fees should more clearly reflect cottage usage, including day usage by members not sleeping at the cottage. Bed-night fees for members will continue, to avoid increasing subscriptions to a level which would discourage long-standing but non-active members from supporting the group, and to maintain some level of control over cottage booking and use. A suggestion that the constitution be amended to include the fact that the membership subscription now includes upkeep of the cottage will be considered at the AGM.

Following the EGM, the committee decided to reduce cottage bed-night fees to £1 for MCG members, and to increase bed-night fees to £2 for guests with effect from 1st January 1989. *Members also have the option of paying £10 with their annual subscription in advance to provide one calendar year's exemption from bed-night fees.*

If you have already sent the Treasurer your cheque for 1989 subs at the old rate you will need to pay him the difference!

MCG TO BUY ROCK DRILL?

The suggestion at the Half-yearly General Meeting that the group should purchase a powered rock drill for drilling shot holes and bolt anchor holes, is being investigated by the committee. As the type of drill in question will cost in the region of £300, it was decided to hire one first for a day's trial. ITEMS FROM IRELAND

CAVING IN THE COUNTY FERMANAGH -- CAVAN REGION

About a year ago whilst spending my annual holidays in Ireland I found myself hitching from County Clare to County Fermanagh in search of a job at the Marble Arch show caves. I hadn't really much idea of the area, just a vague recollection of the odd article about a few of the caves, but I had been told there was a vast area of limestone here and that the show caves were worth a visit.

Hitch-hiking with a rucksack full of damp wetsuit bits, tins of beans and dirty caving kaks was certainly a memorable experience, especially crossing the border between Eire and the North - thank God I hadn't any carbide with me! Once in Northern Ireland I soon realised that apart from the British style road signs and red phone boxes the charm and character of Eire was all around me, and the scenery just mind-blowing. The Marble Arch show cave is just inside the border seemingly in the middle of nowhere but is well sign-posted and easy to find. The advert says "One of the finest show caves in Europe" - it certainly is. The tour starts with a walk through the forest passing massive shake holes and sinks until one reaches the entrance just above the resurgence. A short distance inside and you are placed in a dubious-looking boat and ferried along a splendid section of river passage. The river is quiet and the lighting minimal, providing a stunning effect. From the end of the boat journey the tour continues on foot for an hour or so passing superb formations and classic cave scenery. One particularly memorable point was the "Moses walk". OK, it sounds naff but it is tastefully done, and it is unusual - a sunken walkway brings the visitor right through the water at shoulder height. Clever lighting provides spectacular reflections of the formations in the water. Very nice!

All in all, Marble Arch is a stunning show cave which has been very thoughtfully planned and is carefully managed. It is one of the few I've visited which really provides the casual visitor with a sense of the real underworld. Back at the reception building one can spend a good while oggling at a brilliant display of caving photos or chatting to the staff who are very friendly, well informed and in the main cavers themselves.

I arrived here a total stranger, but within an hour had a complete weekend's caving, accommodation and drinking arranged for me! Within three hours I was underground.

I suppose the main caving area here would be described as the Cuilcagh, a massive flat-topped mountain (2188ft) dominating the surrounding landscape. Hundreds of streams pour off this mountain to disappear into numerous swallet holes, many of which have never been entered (intentionally)! As we drove from Marble Arch along the Marlbank scenic loop road my colleagues pointed out several sites that "could do with a look", some a few yards from the road itself! I was totally bewildered.

We arrived at a pothole miles from anywhere in the middle of a bog; a rubbishy looking hole full of dead dogs, spiders and gnats, but once down and away from daylight we left our eight-legged and dead four-legged friends, to explore a very different cave to what I was used to. My first impression was that it was black, and I wasn't using an FX2! The rock here is very dark and is heavily interlaced with bands of black chert. The effect is somewhat oppressive, your light is immediately lost especially in big chambers where one really feels isolated. The water, of which there is plenty, is rather on the cold side and is generally of a nasty dark brown colour heavily stained with turf. Flood debris is evident everywhere especially fifty feet up in the roof! We spent about four hours in this particular cave and I've never seen such a variety of scenery underground before. I was hooked.

Whatever your interest, there is something here for everyone. For the SRT enthusiast it's heaven. Noonan's Hole for example, one of Ireland's deepest pots at 108m provides an impressive daylight descent comparable to anything in Yorkshire.

If it's diving you're into, the through trip from Noones to Arch is reputed to be one of the best trips possible. A collectors piece (for the smuggler) is the splendid Pollprulisk - Pollnatagha in which you can cross the border underground! There are numerous short sporty trips and formation-wise it's a photographers dream. The splendid "Cascades" cave is surely one of the finest in Ireland with every conceivable variation in calcium carbonate imaginable and as with most our caves there has been little or no damage. If you're into mines then there is plenty of interesting stuff in neighbouring County Leitrim and County Sligo, mainly coal and barytes. What ever you want, this an area well worth consideration, however there are a few problems. The weather is decidedly Irish and unfortunately many of the better trips depend on good weather. The Guinness is mighty and tends to become a priority if you're not careful. The scenery is knock-out, so you can easily slip into a sightseeing holiday if you're not too pissed to drive. There is stacks of potential for future discoveries and access is generally no problem. Responsible visiting English groups are more than welcome, although sadly some groups recently have left untidy dig sites which has led to a few access problems.

For my money this is the finest caving area in Ireland or Britain - and no, I don't work for the Irish Tourist Board, I work at Aillwee Caves in County Clare, which of course are also well worth a visit!

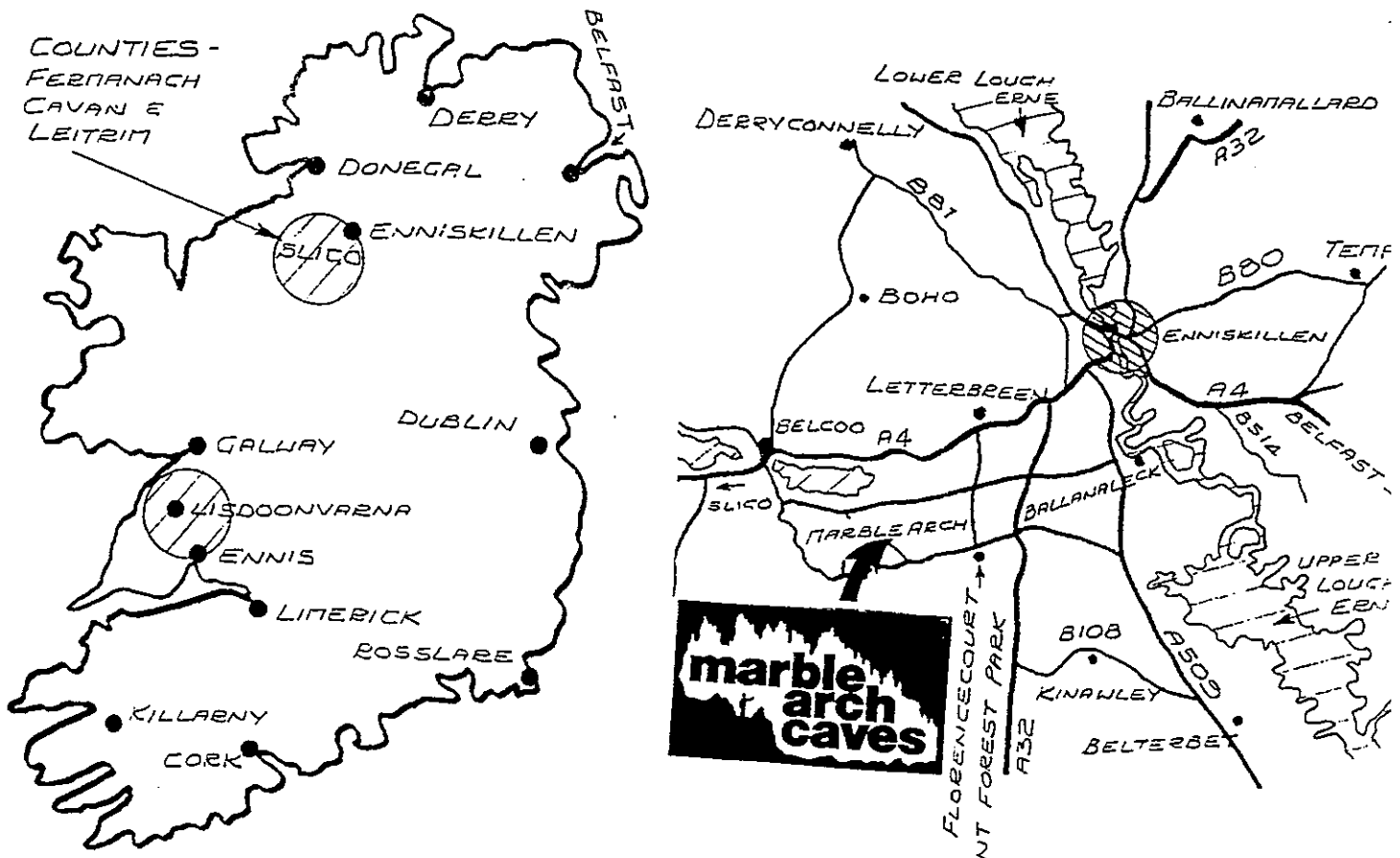
Accommodation from the very basic to the absolute luxury can be easily obtained right in the middle of the main caving areas. MCG digs

BONE HOLE

Spoil removed after water receded, revealing a large loose boulder which sounded hollow when moved. The left hand side was shelving away and draughting nicely. After removing the loose boulder and a toad the rift could be seen belling out promisingly.

BATTERY SWALLET

Following a roof collapse, the dig was stabilised and work continued. A void could be seen 3.8.88 and more bang was needed. This had little effect and the cave remains uninspiring. Some depth is required to locate the limestone and prove our dowsing survey accurate.

UPPER FLOOD

Work continued at the stream sink, clearing away debris from bang. Banged again 10.8.88. Major breakthrough imminent (in the knees of Vince's wetsuit). The dig contains too much water to see much. The Lavatory Trap requires care as the sides are subsiding and may require "free-diving". The old bang wire has been removed so a new bang wire is needed.

ROWBERROW SWALLET

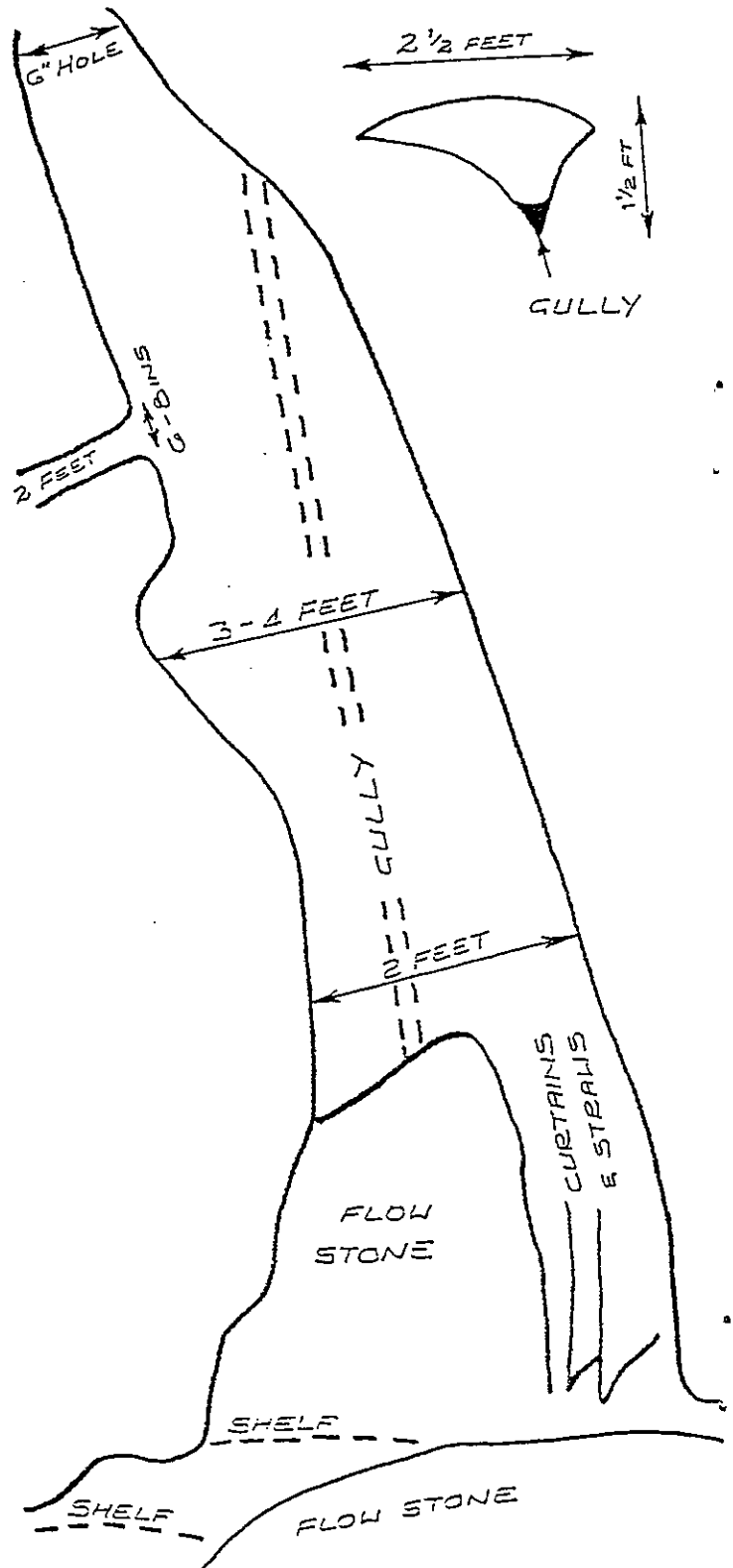
The swallet remains an 8-foot deep pool not draining very quickly. Consequently nothing has been done.

ROD'S POT

5.10.88 Tim and Vee forced through into Eyeball Rift. Approximately 35-foot high aven reducing to a six-inch crack at top. Only formations are at the base. Not very promising in terms of a continuing dig. See sketch opposite. Meanwhile, Dom gained four to six-foot of passage up in PJ1 dig.

12.10.88 A prod in Rod, nuff said!

CODE OF PRACTICE FOR MINE EXPLORATION

Extracts from the National Association of Mining History Organisations guidelines

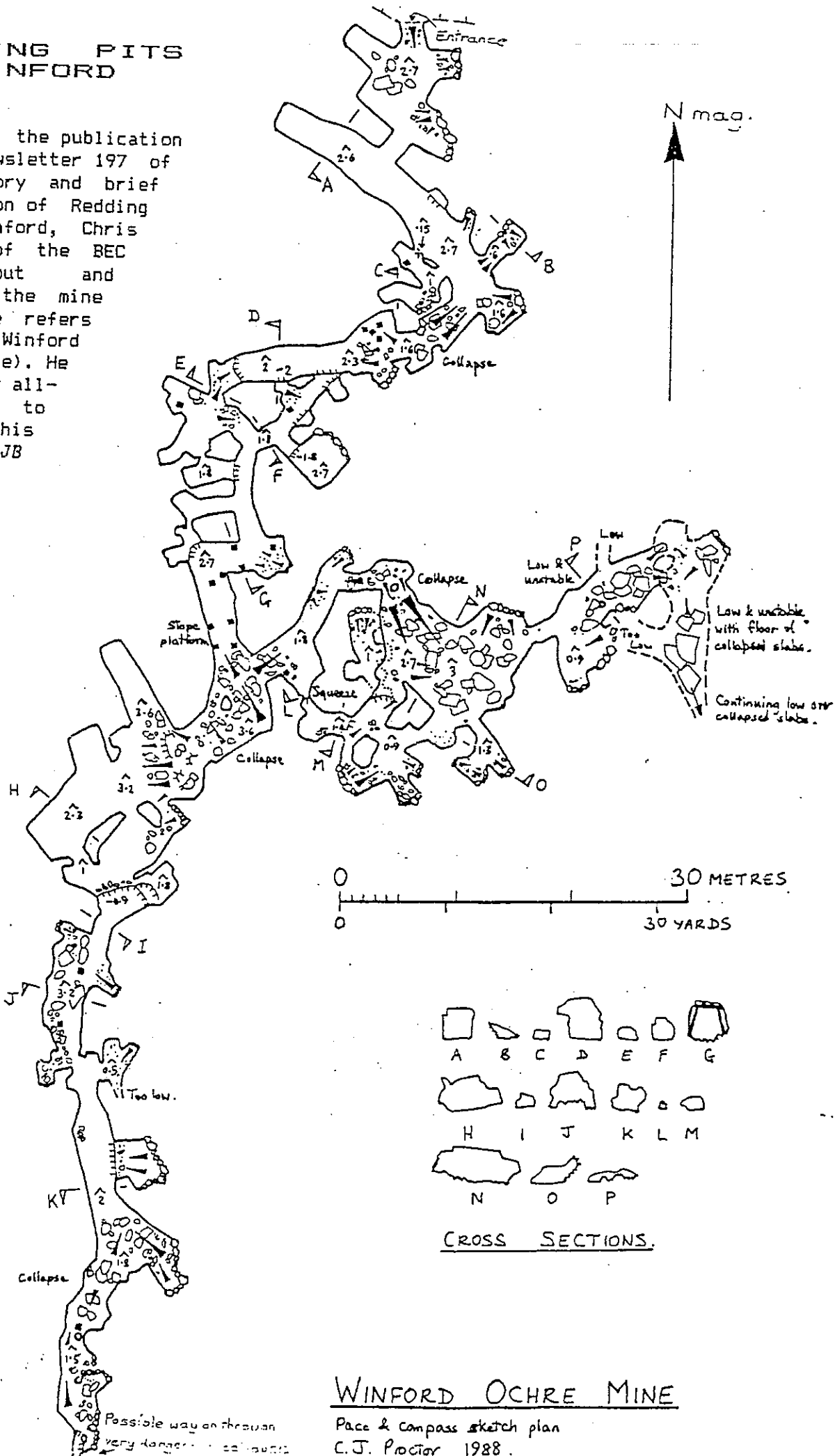
If you are exploring a disused mine, it can be exciting if done properly but lethal if you do not know what you are doing. Here are twelve basic rules for your survival:

1. JOIN A MINING HISTORY GROUP (or a caving group? ed.). They will teach you how to be safe underground.
2. GET THE BASIC GEAR - warm clothing and a boiler suit, strong boots or wellingtons, helmet and lamp.
3. ALWAYS GET PERMISSION. Ask the mine owner for permission to enter. If you don't know the owner, ask the local mining history group. Never break in, or trespass, if permission is refused. Always leave mines safe by replacing gates or lids.
4. TELL SOMEONE WHERE YOU'RE GOING. Leave a message with a responsible person, giving the following details: name and location of the mine; anticipated time down, and time out of, the mine; time due back to the person you have told; details of how to call out the rescue service if needed.
5. NEVER GO UNDERGROUND ALONE OR INCAPABLE. Four is the minimum safe number underground, so that, in the case of an accident, one can stay with the victim and two can go for help. Never take alcohol or drugs before or during a trip, as this will reduce concentration with potentially lethal results.
6. DO NOT EXCEED YOUR CAPABILITY. Choose easy trips at first, and leave the more difficult techniques until you are used to moving underground. Ladder climbing for instance, can be very strenuous at times, and it is always harder climbing out! If in doubt, turning back is better than having to be rescued.
7. DO NOT GET LOST. Some mines are like mazes - it is very easy to get lost. If there is a plan of the mine (your local mining history group can advise you) take a copy with you. A good idea is to cut arrows from bright coloured polythene and, at junctions, leave one pointing to the entrance. Always pick them up on the way out.
8. NEVER CLIMB ON LADDERS AND MACHINERY. You may come across ladders, timbers, etc which were used by the miners. Never use these, as they are of uncertain age, and probably rotten. Don't climb on old machinery as it is probably rusty and may collapse.
9. NEVER CLIMB ON STACKED ROCK OR WALLS. The miners often left waste rock in the mine, stacked up and supported by timbers which have since rotted away, leaving the rock precariously balanced. Don't touch or climb on these features, or you may bring down tons of rock onto yourself and others.
10. NEVER FOOL AROUND UNDERGROUND - it can have tragic endings. Better safe than sorry is a small price to pay for your life and others.
11. DO NOT RUIN THE MINE ENVIRONMENT. Don't hammer minerals indiscriminately, destroy or remove artefacts/archaeological features, interfere with plants or animals. Take only photographs, leave only footprints.
12. KNOW WHAT TO DO IN AN EMERGENCY. Don't panic. Leave someone with the victim. Dial 999, ask for the police, then ask for Cave Rescue. Tell them what has happened, the location of the mine and the victim's injuries.
