# DONATION IN MEMORY OF GRANT SHEPHARD

The following letter has been received from the Red Cross, following the collection made at the AGM:

Thank you for your donation of £250 in memory of Grant Shephard. We greatly appreciate this kind gift. Your Group's contribution brings the total raised to £873 (Ed. now over £1000). All the funds have been put towards Red Cross work in Afghanistan and on the Afghan/Pakistan border. For a number of years we have been contributing to International Red Cross medical programmes on the border - sending Land Rover ambulances as well as providing medical personel and funding. Many thousands of Afghan wounded have been cared for at Red Cross hospitals in Peshawar and Quetta. Often the casualties arrive in very poor condition having struggled for days to reach the border area. First Aid Mobile Teams evacuate the wounded to the hospitals where the staff work at full stretch. A British Red Cross surgical team has been sent to Kabul and is on call 24 hours a day. Medical care is provided for up to 150 patients. Many of the injuries treated are caused by landmines. There are two operating theatres, an intensive care unit, blood bank, laboratory and physiotherapy centre. The orthopaedic centre has been producing and fitting artificial limbs. One month after the hospital opened, the surgical teams had carried out 94 operations on war casualties admitted irrespective of their allegiance. A notice at the entrance states that weapons may not be brought inside! In-service paramedical training is given to Afghan assistant nurses and a close working relationship has been established with the Afghan Red Crescent hospital. We are very grateful for your Group's help for this vital life saving work.
