#### BOOKING RECORD

Guest groups and members are not using the booking sheets correctly, making it impossible for the Treasurer reconcile cottage fees. ON ARRIVAL AT THE COTTAGE would you please write your name on the booking sheet by the bunk you are to take. Large parties please write your INDIVIDUAL NAMES against your bunk number, not bracketed together as a group under the group name. Remember to put your cottage fees in the lectern and record the amount paid on the sheet. ticket holder's should enter "S/T" in the "amount paid" column. One person should collect all fees at the end of the weekend, initial "received by" column on the sheet and delete the names of any people who booked in in advance but did not attend. "amount paid" column should be totalled and the amount carried over to the reverse of the sheet where details of CCC permits issued (30p each) can be added, any expenditure deducted and any other adjustments made. The completed sheet should be sent to Martin Rowe. together with a cheque/cheques for the fees collected. in the envelopes provided in the lectern.

## GROUP BOOKINGS

The general level of guest bookings has been noted by the committee following complaints from members that too many large (12+) group bookings are being accepted for weekends. Existing bookings are to be honoured, but in future at weekends the maximum number of guests will be limited to 18. Due to limited space in the kitchen, it has been decided to further limit the maximum size of any one party to 12 (ie a minibus full). This will prevent large parties monopolising the kitchen and other facilities, while still allowing members and/or another small group to use the cottage at the same time.

We believe that quite a few ladders are down various digs but the tacklewarden would still like to know officially where and ladder numbers. If none of the ladders are recovered or recoverable then Adrian will replace them, but to ensure that new tackle remains available for everyone in the Group to use, he will most probably keep them and issue them only on request. If you intend to book out a ladder, or any other item, for a long period it is curteous to notify the tacklewarden first.

The winch and rock drill haven't been seen at the cottage for some time. Are they missing or on loan to another club? If anyone can shed any light on this situation could they inform the committee as in the present circumstances they would not be insured for loss or damage.

Five short ropes are also missing so Adrian will cut some 110ft ropes into shorter, more useful lengths. He is also buying some new spreaders.

It was thought that the Aven Inspection Lamp was also missing but in fact it had been taken away for repairs. This is just a reminder to the repairer that quite a few people have been asking for it so its early return would be much appreciated (with anticipated thanks for mending it).
