
# Speleo Rhall Night Orienteering Challenge

Mike and Oliver Haseldine did it again, when they organized an excellent night orienteering race in the New Forest on Saturday 6th Feb. Brian Snell, Keith Knight and Darren Gamblin represented the MCG.

March 1999

The first reference point (successfully found) was the office that Oliver works at in the middle of an industrial estate. Here we were given the clues and references for the course out in the Forest. From here we set off for a car park in the woods about a mile and half from Beaulieu Road Railway Station. The basic idea is that you have 5 hours to get as many points as you can. As an incentive to get back on time, for every minute you were late points were deducted, calculated as the square of the time overdue. So for the first minute 1 point, the second two the third four and so on. If you

were twenty minutes late it equated to the theoretical maximum obtainable points. The reference points were well scattered such that to get all of the points possible, you would need to be running hard and be spot on with the navigation. In the boggy ground that we experienced this would be almost impossible.

It was raining as we set off at about 8:00pm for our first chosen reference point and decision to wear wellies instead of walking boots proved a good one we were later to discover. It was soft enough to sink in up to your knee in places. All points were identified with a piece of wood with a code like B1 or TN on it. From some of these points, bonus points could be obtained by finding another marker on a bearing and within a fixed distance, usually somewhere out there in the heather! We didn't take it too seriously, its getting too much like hard work to try running from point to point. Every point we went for though we found. Our only mistake was to unwittingly miss the highest scoring reference plus bonus. We hadn't noticed the small circle penned in on the map and it was only when it was too late to go back that we noticed our mistake. We had been only 200m. from it too. This would have given us another 65 points. which would have put us into 3<sup>rd</sup> place. The standard of navigation was very good with the winning team beating us by almost 100 points.

It makes you want to do better next time. This was the fourth time I had taken part in one of Mike's night events and I can't wait until the next one next year. Hopefully more MCG members might be able to take part.



This site is maintained by John Ganter, an American caver. If you are interested in issues such as the IMAX film referenced in the last newsletter then this would be the obvious next port of call.








